Whilst recorded by the CWGC as W C Pritchard he is known to be William George Pritchard, recorded as George William in the 1911 census.

William was the eldest child of joiner Frederick and Annie Pritchard; they appear to have married in 1893 although there is no definite record of this.

Frederick Pritchard was a much younger brother of Thomas Pritchard, the father of Reg Pritchard who also died in WW1 [see entry 69: (Charles William) Reginald Pritchard]. Frederick and Thomas's parents were stonemason Thomas and Ellen Pritchard of Ness. William and Reg were, therefore, cousins and they died within 6 months of each other although the circumstances of their deaths were very different.

When William was baptised at Neston on 13 January 1895 his parents were living in Ness but in the 1901 census, when all three children had been born, they were on Mill Street in Neston:

Lilian Pritchard was baptised, privately, on 19 June 1897 but no baptism has been found for Joseph Frederick although it is known that he was born in mid-1899.

Frederick and Annie had been married for 18 years and all three children had survived.

William George Pritchard attested for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion Cheshire Regiment at Neston on 22 November 1915 and he gave his occupation as gardener for R L Price, was unmarried, and was living at Rose Cottage, Mill Street, Neston.

Richard Lewis Price who, in the 1911 census (aged 50, born Cardigan), is recorded as being the manager of the London City & Midland Bank in Neston was then living on



Moorside House, near the junction of Moorside Lane and Parkgate Road, was the residence of Richard Lewis Price. The house was then known as *Glanrhos*.

Parkgate Road. The L. C. & M. Bank was created when the Birmingham and Midland Bank (founded in Birmingham in August 1836) merged with the Central Bank of London Ltd in 1891. In 1923 it simplified its name to the Midland bank.

William's medical record noted that he was 5ft 5½ins tall, had a 33½-inch chest and had a 'thickened toe nail on right foot'. After attestation William became a reservist - the 3<sup>rd</sup> (Reserve) Battalion Cheshire Regiment had been formed in August 1914 in Chester and was a training unit which remained in the UK throughout the war, providing drafts for other battalions.

Whilst the Regimental Depot remained at Chester, the battalion moved to war station at Birkenhead to assist with the Mersey Defences. On 31 January 1916 William was mobilised and sent for training duties at Blundellsands (near Southport) where he contracted pneumonia and died in Windy Knowe Hospital, a temporary military hospital at Blundellsands, Great Crosby on 2 February 1916.

He had served for just 73 days and was buried at Liverpool (Kirkdale) Cemetery with a military funeral - it is not known why he wasn't buried at Neston.

# NESTON "DERBY" MAN

DIES IN TRAINING.

His many friends will hear with great regret of the sudden death of Private William Pritchard, the cldest son of Mr. Fred Pritchard, of Mill-street, Neston. The young man—he was only 21 years of age—had only quite recently been called up under the Derby system, and had been training with the 3rd Cheshires at Blundellsands. A few days ago he developed pneumonia, and passed away on Thursday last at the Seaforth Hospital. He was interred in the Memorial ground at the Kirkdale Cemetery on Monday afternoon, with full military honours. A large number of his comrades in the regiment were in attendance, in addition to the military band and the firing party, the ceremony being a most impressive one. Amongst the relatives and friends who travelled over from Neston were Mr. Fred Pritchard (father), Master Fred Pritchard (brother), Mr. Thomas Pritchard (uncle), and Mr. R. L. Price (his late employer).

It is believed that Annie Pritchard died in the Bebington area in early 1916 aged 51 and that Frederick Pritchard died in West Wirral in early 1949 aged 84.

It is recorded in William's Service Record that his brother, (Joseph) Frederick, was also serving in the army and it is known that Frederick was a post office engineer who served with the Bedford "A" Signal Depot RE. He survived and was demobilised in March 1920.

Joseph Frederick Pritchard married Aletheia Rushton Woods at a Civil Marriage on Wirral in mid-1928 and he may have died in 1969 aged 71. At the time of the 1939 Register (29 September) he was living at 67 Mayfield Gardens, off Liverpool Road, Neston (below) Confusingly, his date of birth is recorded as 16

Confusingly, his date of birth is recorded as 16 June 1897 - this was the date on which his sister, Lilian Pritchard, was baptised privately. It is known from the birth register that Joseph Frederick Pritchard was actually born in Neston in mid-1899. In fact, from his death record in mid-1974, it is known that he was born on 16 June 1899.

It may be presumed that the two lines on the Register which have been redacted (as of March 2018) contain the details of the two known

children of Joseph and Aletheia; Doreen Rushton Pritchard was born in early 1929 and Jean Rushton Pritchard was born in late 1934, both in Neston. It is not known when Aletheia died although it would appear to be after mid-1981.

In the household was unmarried daughter Lillian (born 20 February 1896, grocery shop assistant) together with Sarah Briscoe (a widow, born 3 February 1870 and her unmarried daughter Leah (born 10 August 1892). It is known that Sarah Tilley married Neston baker William Briscoe at Our Lady & St. Nicholas & St. Anne, the Liverpool Parish Church, in in early 1890 and that Leah was baptised at Neston Parish Church on 11 September 1892. It is also believed that William Briscoe died, aged 67, in early 1925 but the connection between the Pritchard, Briscoe and Tilley families is unknown.
